We provide specialized education that supports students with diverse learning needs. Our academic program is at the heart of what we do but we realize that students are most successful when supported in their social and emotional growth. We have a team of dedicated counsellors and a Developmental Specialist who work with our education team to support students through their academic journey.

KGMS is recruiting for a Developmental Specialist / Behaviour Consultant to join our Student Services Team.

The KGMS Developmental Specialist's multidisciplinary role assists parents, teachers, OTs, SLPs, Psychologists and Counsellors in creating plans to manage behaviours that affect a student's learning. The Developmental Specialist works within a multidisciplinary team to provide a comprehensive approach to behaviour management that includes evaluation, observation, education, interventions and regular monitoring. They may work one-on-one with students and use teaching methods to target specific behaviours and achieve goals such as self-regulation, following classroom routines, and integrating positively into the classroom environment. The developmental specialist will work alongside classroom educators to support students, families, and faculty.

Responsibilities:

- Develop caring and supportive relationships with the students in the classroom
- Assist with the emotional and social development of the student
- Conduct behavioural observations of students to determine their strengths and areas of development in social, emotional behavioural and learning areas
- Implement positive behaviour plans designed to help the student learn self-regulation skills and target specific areas for improvement
- Work one-on-one (short-term) with the students when necessary

- Build a strong working relationship with the family of the student as well as any other appropriate community stakeholders (e.g. Behaviour Interventionists)
- Effectively communicate with the family providing progress reports
- Assist teachers with delivering the curriculum to the student to suit the learning needs of that student best
- Assist in the planning and implementation of the daily schedule and programme
- Collaborate with the teachers in teaching lessons in a variety of ways
- Staff development/training as determined by the administration
- Assist with the evaluation and assessment of the student's progress
- Empower families by providing them with skills and techniques to support the positive behaviour development of the student
- Communicates and collaborates with classroom teachers, admin team members, students, parents and community support.
- Is an engaged team member in the KGMS community
